FREE MARKET, an event to minister to the one-hundred poorest families in Douglas County, will be held on Saturday, May 1. DCEF is partnering with Douglas County Social Services, who will help screen persons to receive vouchers. The location is yet to be determined, as we are looking for a large neutral location. SINGLE MOM'S OIL CHANGE OUTREACH – The question was raised if there is adequate interest in doing this event again this year. There was discussion about other possible ways to minister to single moms in the community and it was decided to not pursue the oil change project this year.

NEW CHURCH PLANT – Brian Farrar and his wife, Arlene, were introduced as pastors of Family of Faith, a new church plant in the Green/Winston area. A time of prayer for the Farrars and Family of Faith was held.

PRAYER, CARE, SHARE RESOURCE – Craig Schlesinger talked briefly about the book, *I'm Gonna Let It Shine* by Jim Montgomery, a quick-read description of the "Lighthouse Movement." A copy of the book is available to read if it will keep being passed on to others.

FASTER PASTOR RACE – Phil Morrow of KGRV announced that the next "Faster Pastor" race will be July 17 at the Douglas County Speedway. Phil would like to assemble a team of five persons to be part of a discussion/brainstorming work group. Brian Farrar, Jon Nutter, and Joe Whipple agreed to meet at least one time. Phil's goal is to have ten "Hornet" class cars in the race this year that could be shared with ten other pastors.
